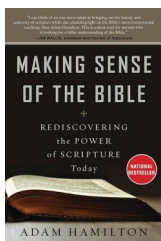
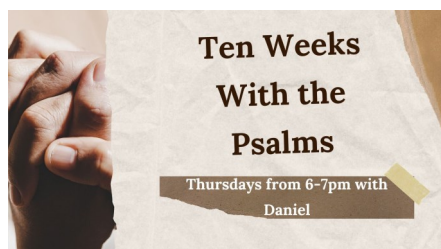


“Ten Weeks With the Psalms”

New Fall Bible Study Monday Mornings, 9:30 – 11 AM

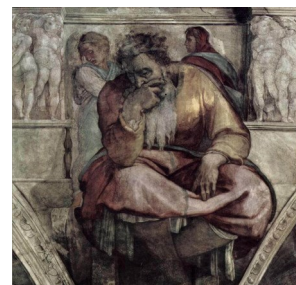

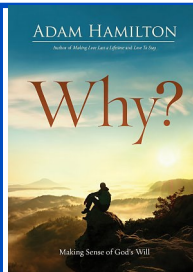

The Pastor's Wednesday afternoon study will resume on **September 13 at 1:30 PM** with "Why".

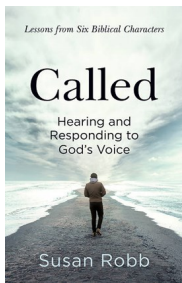
Where is God when tragedy and suffering strike?

When the ground shakes, and a poor nation's economy is destroyed; when the waters rise, washing away a community's hopes and dreams; when a child suffers neglect and abuse; when violence tears apart nations where is God? If God is all powerful, and if each one of us is a beloved child of God, then how can God allow tragedy and suffering to mar his creation?

In “Why?”, best-selling author, Adam Hamilton, brings fresh insight to the age-old question of how to understand the will of God. Rejecting simplistic answers and unexamined assumptions, he lays out core ideas for comprehending God's plan for the world, including:

God will not take away our free will, even when we use it to grieve him. God will never abandon us, especially in the midst of our suffering. While God is not the author of suffering, God will bring blessing out of tragedy."

The study will be an expansion on the book of the same title. A few copies are available at church, but if you would like for us to order one of your own, let Pastor Brian know.



3M to Begin on Wednesday, September 27

Trinity Preschool

Trinity Preschool and Parents' Morning Out is a comprehensive half-day, weekday program for children between the ages of 1 to 5 years old. It is a developmental program offered in a loving and nurturing environment to help children grow mentally, physically, emotionally, socially, and spiritually. Trinity Preschool/PMO is an outreach ministry of Trinity United Methodist Church (TUMC).

We have a few 4 year old and 2 year old spaces available 2023-24 school year. Your child must be 4 or 2 by September 30, 2023 to enter these programs. Open enrollment for the 2024-25 school year for TUMC members and past and current patrons is going on now through September 30. HELP NEEDED:

Students in grades 6-12 with an interest in training to serve as an acolyte!

The Trinity Acolyte program currently involves 30+ young people in grades 6-12 who are selected because of their interest and commitment to the worship experience. Acolytes are helpers and assist in many aspects of the worship service. This program is a hallmark of worship at Trinity and it is a wonderful way for youth to learn and grow in their faith through active participation in the worship experience.

First year acolytes are considered acolytes-in-training for one year. Selected senior high acolytes (grades 10-12) are given additional training in order to assist in special activities. Participation for all students usually involves serving as the Crucifer (will carry the cross), being a candle lighter (responsible for lighting and extinguishing altar candles, helping with the offering), or being a Bible bearer (places the Bible on the altar).

The Trinity Acolyte Program is an excellent example of the commitment of Trinity young people in service to their church and their faith.

FAQs:

Who can participate?

Youth in grades 6-12

Do acolytes need to be confirmed in the Methodist church?

No; confirmation is not a requirement to participate!

How often do acolytes serve?

Availability is requested on a monthly basis, so you can participate when your schedule permits! Most serve about once a month. Special church events such as Christmas and Easter may involve more frequent participation.

What if you don't typically attend the 11am service?

Many acolytes are not regular 11am attendees, but they attend that service when scheduled. It gives youth an opportunity to fully engage in the worship offerings at TUMC and learn even more.

Is training provided?

Yes! Acolytes will receive instruction and will begin with experienced acolytes who can assist and answer questions.

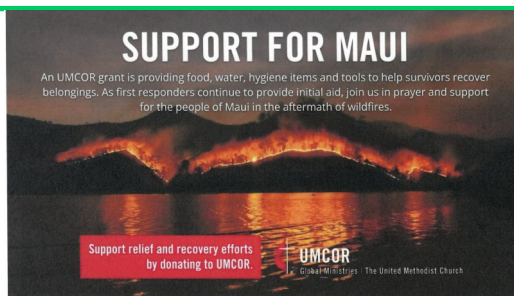

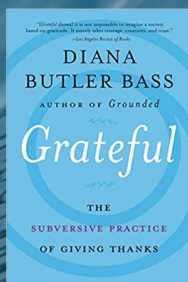
Wildfires in Hawaii
