

Building on Past Growth

The original Trinity building is 70 years old. Many additions and repairs have been completed over the years, including: the sanctuary in 1956, Education Wing in 1960, Trinity Hall, offices and rest of East wing in 1989.

The last capital campaign was in 2008, which supported the addition of the Welcome Center in 2010.

Long Range Facilities plan was completed in 2019, promptly followed by COVID which delayed any immediate action from that study.

Since then, we were able to accomplish many projects without a formal capital campaign or additional debt, all of which came from the 2019 long range facilities planning. All of the projects were accomplished by in kind and individual financial gifts.

The projects include:

1. Youth Center
2. Office area
3. 3rd floor education wing floors
4. Parlor renovation
5. Chapel renovation
6. New signage
