This is what we are learning about in December:

Grab your sandals, sunblock, and swim gear because it's time for a Christmas Vacation! We'll be making sand angels and roasting chestnuts around an open bonfire on our tropical getaway. You've never experienced Christmas like this! In this five-week series, we'll focus on the birth of Jesus and the way God had been planning things from the very beginning. We'll see how God sent Jesus for a reason, learn to trust God's timing, understand why God gives us what's best, and see how Jesus is why we celebrate because Jesus is God's gift to the world.



Pick up your Family Advent Kit in the Welcome Center! Inside are a few activities to help you focus on Jesus during this busy Advent season leading up to Christmas!



Our pageant will take place during our 4pm Christmas Eve service! When kids arrive at church for the service, they can choose which character they would like to be (shepherd, angel, or animal) and we will have costumes available for them to wear! Kids will sit with their family until they are called forward to participate! Please arrive early so you have enough time to get everyone dressed up in a costume! All kids are welcome to participate; even your out of town guests!

NATIVITY TRAIL MIX RECIPE

In a bowl, mix each of these ingredients to make your own Nativity Trail Mix! Use however much of each one you like!

Before you serve to your family, talk about the symbolism of each ingredient to the Nativity story in the Bible. Here is what each one represents:

Pretzel Sticks - This symbolizes the stable where Jesus was born. Kids can take several sticks and make an outline of a stable. Tell your kids that the stable we think of is not the same kind of stable that was found in ancient Bethlehem. It was more like a cave that housed animals.

Animal Crackers - These symbolize the animals that were in the stable (cave) the night that Jesus was born.

Popcorn - This represents how the angels "popped" up on the night Jesus was born and appeared to the shepherds to tell them about the birth of Jesus.

Mini Marshmallows - These remind us of soft pillows we sleep on, which reminds us of how there was no place for Jesus to lay His head the night He was born; there was only hay.

Hershey Hugs & Kisses - These remind us of how much love Jesus has for us by coming to earth to be born so that He could save us from our sins and we can live forever with Him in heaven one day.

Mini Candy Canes - These remind us of the shepherds who visited Jesus the night He was born. Show kids how when you turn them upside down it makes a J-shape which reminds us of Jesus!

Greening Your Decorating

Christmas lights are symbols of the Light that came into the world with the birth of Christ. Enjoy them and **use LEDs wherever you can** to take

care of the world that Jesus lit up with his presence. Give a package or two to someone you love to help them love creation.

Go live! Live trees that you can replant are kindest to the environment. A cut tree harvested from an organic tree farm will likely be replaced with two others.

If you already own an artificial tree, use it for at least 10 years. Keep the tree in good condition so that you can pass it on to someone else who won't need to buy one.

Ask parents or grandparents to give you an ornament that has been a part of your growing-up Christmas traditions. Pass along its story to your children.

Make your own tree ornaments representing something meaningful to you. Glue family photos to card stock and hang on the tree. Create some new stories to tell each Christmas.

Go for reusable gift bags rather than wrapping paper. Fancy paper with foil, glitter or other non-paper materials can't be recycled. The short fibers in tissue paper make it unrecyclable too.

Go retro. **String popcorn and cranberries** on cotton thread. After Christmas, put the strings outside for the birds to munch on or decompose in the soil.

Rather than buying new decorations, **turn to thrift shops and garage sales** to find one-of-a-kind used ornaments and holiday décor.

Winter Weather Decisions

Decisions for closing our building related to winter weather are tricky. Basically, we follow the closing announcements from Henrico County Public Schools. For example, if

schools close early or are on a delayed opening, Trinity's opening and closing times are adjusted. If Henrico schools are closed, Trinity will be closed, and this would include all day and evening events. Our ability to re-open the building after a winter weather event depends upon how quickly we can clear our sidewalks and parking lots. If we can safely get people on to our grounds and into our building, then Trinity might return to normal operations quicker than the school system.
