## Young at Heart welcomes Nelson Calisch

Come join Young at Heart on **Tuesday**, **January 23** at 2 PM in the Welcome Center where we will join in fellowship and hear Nelson Calisch share "The Living New Deal: What You Can See – What You Can't See – and How it Impacts You."

When Franklin Delano Roosevelt was inaugurated as the thirty-second U.S. president in 1933, the country was in the worst financial crisis in the nation's history. Unemployment had reached 25 percent, and a series of emergency measures were quickly implemented to meet the challenge. Roosevelt named his program "The New Deal," and he promised to restore prosperity to everyday Americans. While the "New Deal" was intended to be a temporary intervention for a nagging crisis, it nevertheless remains a part of the everyday American life in ways that most people never consider. There are abundant examples of projects that still exist throughout the country, and many are in Virginia and in Richmond as well. Nelson will share his photographs of public artwork from this period as well as identify other physical evidence of this administration's effort to tame "The Great Depression"; all within driving range. Also discussed will be the programs that still exist in one form or another and how they apply to life today. Personal photographs, short documentary clips, and downloaded photos will enhance the lecture and, hopefully, generate discussion.

Nelson is an entertaining and engaging speaker. Everyone is welcome! And yes, we will have refreshments!

#### Kids Discipleship at 10am


Kids Discipleship during the 10am hour occurs in these locations:

## **Building Security Reminders**

If you come to the church for a meeting, to pick up an item, or drop off an item, remember the perimeter doors for the building are kept locked. This is per recommendations by the Henrico County Police Department, our insurance carrier, and endorsed by our Trustees.

The door to the church office is monitored with a camera and a security button to allow a person access. This is your best entry point if you are not here for a class or event.

For example, if you are attending a funeral during a weekday afternoon, doors to the Welcome Center, the Sanctuary foyers, and doors in the Trinity Hall wing will be accessible. If you are taking a morning or afternoon class in the Trinity Hall wing, you have two access points the church office door and the east entrance door at the back of Trinity Hall.

We are not trying to make entry into the building difficult. Rather, we are attempting to maintain a safe environment in a world that can be unpredictable.

### **Information from Finance**

#### Gifts of Stock

Many members choose to make donations of stock as a tax-deductible contribution to Trinity. The Virginia United Methodist Foundation provides this brokerage service to churches free of charge. While our current broker has served us faithfully for many years, this is an offer we feel we can't pass up. Find "Stock" and follow the directions or call the church office and we can send you the form. As always, please let the Financial Administrator know when you have initiated a stock gift so we can be looking for the check and can match the check with the donor.

#### **Calendar Year-end Contributions**

IRS Code 10170A-1(b) states that only funds received by December 31, 2023 or postmarked by December 31, 2023 may be counted as 2023 contributions. The date of receipt or the postmark is the key to determining the year of receipt. Thus, if someone hand carries a check to the church on January 1, 2024 that is dated December 31, 2023 it is a 2024 gift according to IRS regulations. But, if a check arrives by mail at the church on January 1, 2024 and it is postmarked December 31, 2023 and the check is dated December 31, 2023 or before, it is a 2023 gift. Please try to get your contributions for the calendar year into the church office by December 29, 2023. If you have any questions, call Nancy Berryman at 288-6056.

## Winter Weather Decisions



Decisions for closing our building related to winter weather are tricky. Basically, we follow the closing announcements from Henrico County

Public Schools. For example, if schools close early or are on a delayed opening, Trinity's opening and closing times are adjusted. If Henrico schools are closed, Trinity will be closed, and this would include all day and evening events. Our ability to re-open the building after a winter weather event depends upon how quickly we can clear our sidewalks and parking lots. If we can safely get people on to our grounds and into our building, then Trinity might return to normal operations quicker than the school system. Decisions related to closing the building on Saturdays and Sundays will be made based upon weather conditions at that time. Ouestions? Contact Bill Pike.
