Us just throwing resources at it won't fix it either, as education and community buy in is absolutely necessary for success. In my heart, I know there has to be a sustainable solution.

In our world, we tend to always be striving for more. Every advertisement we see pushes us to buy the newest version of a thing. We never have enough, and are never really happy. Here in Honduras, happiness is not tied to possessions as much as happiness is found in community, family, and relationships. I urge you to look around, recognize and be grateful for what you have, and foster the relationships that really mean something.

## 2023 Pinnacle Living Samaritan Award

Trinity UMC (Richmond), Reveille UMC, and Gum Spring UMC received the Samaritan Award for being three of the Virginia Annual Conference United Methodist churches with the highest level of giving to the Samaritan Program (June 2022 - May 2023). The Samaritan Program has been an integral part of the Pinnacle Living mission and ministry since 1948. Trinity UMC, Reveille UMC, and Gum Spring UMC are truly "Good Samaritan" churches when it comes to supporting the benevolent care mission of Pinnacle Living. They are among the top ten Virginia Conference congregations in giving to the Samaritan Program during the 2023 fiscal year.

#### A Better World by Helping Our Planet

Earth Day 2024 is on April 22. The theme, Planet vs. Plastics, calls us to advocate for widespread awareness on the health risk of plastics, rapidly phase out all single use plastics and demand an end to fast fashion.

Reducing plastic waste is critical:

- Each year in the USA only 5% of plastic waste is recycled, leaving an estimated 51 million tons of plastic waste.
- Each day 500 million plastic straws are used and almost all are thrown away.
- Each minute globally one million plastic bags are used and only 1% are recycled.

By the year 2050 scientists predict that pound for pound there will be more plastic waste in oceans than fish.

For many people single use plastic bottles are a main source of water. Yet making plastic bottles requires six times as much water as a bottle itself contains. 100 billion plastic beverage containers were sold last year in the USA.

Start helping the environment by eliminating single use plastic bottles and straws in your home. Use reusable drink containers and refuse plastic straws.

EARTHDAY.ORG is the world's largest recruiter to the environmental movement, working in 192 countries. More than 1 billion people now participate in Earth Day activities each year, making it the largest civic observance in the world.



co County Public Schools. For example, if schools close early or are on a delayed opening, Trinity's opening and closing times are adjusted. If Henrico schools are closed, Trinity will be closed, and this would include all day and evening events. Our ability to re-open the building after a winter weather event depends upon how quickly we can clear our sidewalks and parking lots. If we can safely get people on to our grounds and into our building, then Trinity might return to normal operations quicker than the school system. Decisions related to closing the building on Saturdays and Sundays will be made based upon weather conditions at that time.
