Pastor's Corner

Happy Easter!

Yes, it is Easter. Easter is not one day. The United Methodist Book of Worship says, "The Easter Season, also known as the Great Fifty Days, begins at sunset Easter Eve and continues through the Day of Pentecost. It is the most joyous and celebrative season of the Christian Year. It focuses on Christ's resurrection and ascension and on the givings of the Holy Spirit on the first Easter (John 20:22-23) and the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2. The ancient Christian's name for this festival is *Pasch*, derived from the Hebrew *pesah* ("deliverance" or "passover"), thus connecting the Resurrection to the Exodus. The origin of the English word *Easter* is disputed but may come from the Anglo-Saxon spring goddess Eastre and her festival. *Pentecost* comes from the Greek *pentekoste*, which means "fiftieth." It refers to the Jewish Feast of Weeks, which Greek-speaking Jews called the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2:1). Early Christians also used the term Pentecost to refer to the Great Fifty Days as a season."

Contrary to our modern culture that tries to condense a season into a day and quickly move on, Easter is a 50-day long celebration of Christ's resurrection and what that means for our lives. This year, Easter ends on Pentecost on May 19. The idea of such a long celebration of God's work seems pretty significant to me.

Here at Trinity, we have much to celebrate! We are growing and we have increased excitement about our ministries within and without. This month alone, we are getting ready to begin parts of our badly needed renovation, accepting new members, beginning Confirmation classes, holding our annual Spring Fest, celebrating God's Creation, and praying for our denomination's international meeting of General Conference.

Continue to proclaim Christ's resurrection. Continue to celebrate who we are. Continue to celebrate what we do. Continue to support the mission and ministries of this church as we strive to be faithful to God's calling in this place and this time.

Easter is meant to be a time of celebration. Celebrate well.

Update from Trustees

We have an opportunity to jump start our renovation project with some demolition work. At this time, the demo work is scheduled to start on Monday, April 22. This will involve removing the ceiling in the follow areas: Banner closet, Room 314, Arts Closet, Library, Handbells room, Room 310, and the hallway that runs from the balcony to the second floor of the Preschool wing. The quicker start allows the HVAC contractor access to attic space and the opportunity to begin important preliminary work. This demo work will require the temporary relocation of two Preschool classrooms and two Sunday school classrooms. Please know that construction schedules can change. The Trustees thank you in advance for your flexibility and patience. Additional updates will be provided in the weekly Connection.

Lenten Easter Mission Offering



For many years, Trinity member, Bill Burch, has given outstanding leadership as a volunteer with multiple Habitat projects. Bill will be Trinity's point person for our participation in the Unity Build.

Our one reserved work date is **Saturday**, **June 1**. On this date, we are required to provide eight volunteers. We can also signup to volunteer on Thursday, Friday, or Saturday during the build time frame. Construction volunteers work from 8 AM to 3 PM. There is a break for lunch and water is provided.

Earth Day 2024 Planet vs. Plastics
